## TWO NEUBAUER FELLOW-LED SCHOOLS RECEIVE 2021 NATIONAL BLUE RIBBON RECOGNITION

Girard Academy Music Program (GAMP) & Penn Alexander School Respectively Recognized by the U.S. Department of Education for Overall Academic Excellence and Progress in Closing Achievement Gaps

GAMP has continued to ignite excellence among students of diverse socioeconomic and cultural backgrounds under the leadership of Moore. Leveraging the school's renowned music education program and award-winning academics, GAMP saw a nearly 100% college acceptance rate among the 2020 senior class, with scholarships valued over \$1-2 million. Since becoming principal in 2018, Moore consistently increased daily student attendance rates year-over-year while sustaining a 100% high school graduation rate.

"Receiving the National Blue Ribbon Award for Overall Academic Excellence is a testament to the hard work and engagement of GAMP's team of educators, students and our entire school community" said Jovan Moore, principal of GAMP and 2019 Neubauer Fellow. Penn Alexander School (PAS) is among an elite network of schools that have been recognized as a National Blue Ribbon School twice. After first being recognized in 2016 for its exemplary work in narrowing the achievement gap under the leadership Michael Farrell, PAS is again recognized in 2021 for its continued efforts to improve achievement. The combined efforts of current principal and 2018 Neubauer Fellow Lauren Overton, Michael Farrell, and interim principal Megan Wapner produced 11 National Board-Certified Teachers, maintained a 98% acceptance rate to selective high schools and earned numerous achievements in science, technology, music, history, writing, and environmental and racial justice.

"Penn Alexander School is honored to again be recognized as a National Blue Ribbon School for Progress in Closing Achievement Gaps as it demonstrates our school's continued commitment to bridging gaps related to gender, race and academic achievements," said Lauren Overton, principal of Penn Alexander School and 2018 Neubauer Fellow. "For our school, this distinction was many years in the making as closing the achievement gap was introduced as an area of focus for Penn Alexander at its founding in 2001. With the support of the Neubauer Fellowship, I was able to join this high-achieving team to lead the ongoing efforts to provide an equitable and purposeful learning experience for our students. The Neubauer Fellowship played a pivotal role in my personal leadership growth, and I look forward to working hand-in-hand with the Philadelphia Academy of School Leaders as we roll up our sleeves to continue our efforts in the years ahead."
